College Credit Plus

Information and Guidelines

Ohio's new College Credit Plus can help students in grades 7-12 earn college and high school credits at the same time by taking college courses from community colleges or universities. The purpose of this program is to promote rigorous academic pursuits and to provide a wide variety of options to college-ready students. Taking a college course from a public college or university through College Credit Plus is free (no cost for tuition, books, or fees)*.

In order to be eligible to take college-level courses through Columbus State Community College you must meet the following requirements:

- Have a cumulative **High School GPA of 3.0 or higher.**
- Achieve eligible scores on approved assessment exam (CCP Placement Tests)

Middle school students who do not have a high school GPA, must take the reading, writing, and math placement tests before registering for college credit classes

STEPS TO TAKE TO APPLY FOR CCP CLASSES:

1. Apply for admission to Columbus State: complete an application for admission to Columbus State. No application fee or essay is required. Link:

2. Create a Columbus State email and password.
3. **TURN IN REQUIRED FORMS:** Permission Slip and Student Questionnaire to Ms.Ramsdell-- forms are located outside the counseling office or on Google Classroom.
4. **Complete the online orientation**
5. **Register for classes:** Work with Ms. Ramsdell to choose the right courses to meet your high school graduation requirements while also meeting your goals for your college degree!
6. Complete the required registration documents and turn them in to Ms. Ramsdell--located outside her office or on Google Classroom
7. Become familiar with Columbus State Blackboard and Email- Check daily!

We can also assist 7th and 8th graders to sign up for College Credit Plus classes if they choose this option in addition to their CPA coursework. 7th and 8th grade students choosing to enroll in College Credit Plus must do the coursework on their own time. Students will not receive time during the school day to complete their work or communicate with their professors.

Students must be responsible for all course deadlines and communications with their professors. By being concurrently enrolled in CPA they can earn a high school credit as well as a college credit. Students will not have to take end-of-course assessments for the high school course upon successful completion of the college course, with the exception of their Physical Science requirement.

*Students who receive a failing grade in any college course will be required to pay back all fees associated with the course (including tuition and books) to CPA.
